

The Book: Understanding Limerick



Dr Niamh Hourigan

Niamh Hourigan is Lecturer and Head of Graduate Studies in Sociology at University College Cork. In 2011 Cork University Press published *Understanding Limerick: Social Exclusion and Change*, an edited collection on crime and disadvantage in Limerick. As well as editing the book, and contributing its introduction and conclusions, Niamh wrote Part Two: 'Living with Fear and Feuding in Limerick'.

The problem

Part Two included these chapters:

- A History of Social Exclusion in Limerick
- Divided Communities: mapping the social structure of disadvantaged neighbourhoods in Limerick

- Organised Crime and Community Violence: understanding Limerick's 'regimes of fear'
- The Sociology of Feuding: Limerick gangland and traveller feuds compared
- Lessons from Limerick: policing, child protection, regeneration.

But her own and other chapters make it clear that the story is not just one of crime and violence. They also show that the current status of the affected areas was not inevitable.



The book shows that ...

... the severely deprived in Limerick have experienced a range of different forms of social exclusion which have intersected in an almost unique way to create sharp social divisions within the city.
