Every day we also have a fun evening activity such as dress up, decathlon, or a games session (indoor and outdoors) There is also plenty of opportunity to get to know other young people, to talk, and quiet time to reflect on the day.

THE THEME OF JYM 2024

the impact of Quakers historically and
their lasting impact on Quakerism,
what it means to be a quaker today,
and what we imagine the future of
Quakerism will be.
